Four principle objectives guide the activities of our club.

- Breeding Quality - To encourage quality breeding of pure bred Scottish Terriers such that everything possible is done to perfect their natural qualities.
- Breed Standards - To promote the standard of the breed as approved by the American Kennel Club as being the only standard of excellence by which Scottish Terriers are judged.
- Breed Protection - To protect and advance the breed by vigorously encouraging sportsmanlike competition at dog shows.
- Sanctioned Shows - To conduct licensed specialty shows as sanctioned by the American Kennel Club.

The STCGA hosts two major events annually. In April we host our Scottish Terrier Specialty at Jim Miller Park in Marietta, GA. Our show is a favorite with top breeders in the country and in 2013 we were honored to host the National Rotating Specialty with the Scottish Terrier Club of America. The other event, held in the fall, is "Fala Day," celebrated at Roosevelt's Little White House in Warm Springs, GA. For 30 years by our Club.
